Situations:


Thefts - Violence Active Shooter Active Killer ID – Theft Opiate Pandemic

Organization Commitment to your Safety

- MIOSHA Requirements
 - Safe and secure work environment
- Workplace Violence Policy
- WPVAT Adm-Security-HR- Safety
- Staff education (Lunch and Learns) and active shooter training (Run-Hide-Fight)
- Emergency Alerts and notification (overhead/Everbridge)
- Armed versus not armed –security
- Weapons free facility posted
- Metal detectors
- Stop the bleed training
- Security Assessments in key areas


RUN

- If there is an accessible escape path, attempt to evacuate the premises
- Do a mental fire drill and have an escape route in mind
- How many shooters are there?
- Consider the possibility of explosive devices

HIDE

- Find a place where the shooter is less likely to find you
- Lock the door if so equipped
- Barricade/Secure the door
 - With anything available
 - Note which way the door opens
- Consider an area that provides some protection
- Dim lights and silence electronic devices

HIDE-Barricading Options









Fight

- Have a plan
- Attack upon entry
- Use distraction techniques
- Attack the aggressor
 - Improvise weapon
 - Attack both high and low
 - Take him to the ground and disarm
 - Keep him on the ground pin limbs and head
- Separate the aggressor from the weapon

You Can Survive!

- Remember your options
- Make a decision <u>time is critical</u>
- Call 911 as soon as possible
- RUN to a safe location
- HIDE and attempt to barricade your space
- FIGHT to repel the threat

What is an Active Shooter/Active Killer?


Federal Bureau of Investigation:


- "An individual actively engaged in killing or attempting to kill people in a populated area."
- Weapons of Choice
 - Firearms
 - Knives/Blades
 - Vehicles
 - Explosives
- Identified 250 (ASI) incidents from 2000 to 2017

Active Shooter Incidents in the United States between 2000-2017





Active Shooters Incidents 2000-2017

General Workplace Violence

- Possible origination of violent acts, including physical assaults
 - 1. Outsiders.
 - Persons who are disgruntled with the service of your company including patients, patient's families, visitors or other customers.
 - 3. Coworkers, current and former.
 - 4. Spouses/Family/Intimate partner (Domestic Violence).

Behaviors to look for in potential perpetrators

- 1. They make verbal threats.
- Harassment.
- 3. Intimidation.
- 4. Flat tires or damaged vehicles.
- 5. Corrupt, threatening or disturbing emails, social media.
- 6. Documenting others activities.
- 7. "Victimized" mentality.
- 8. Listen for possible shooters talking beforehand

Remember

- If it's suspicious... Report it!
 - Suspicious or threatening behavior
 - Suspicious items, packages, or vehicles
