SUBJECT: Advocating for a Standardized Bereavement Policy in the State

of Michigan

ACTION TAKEN BY MOA: Adopted as Amended

- 1 WHEREAS, Michigan currently lacks a standardized statewide bereavement leave policy that
- 2 requires all employers to provide bereavement leave, resulting in inconsistent access to adequate
- 3 time for grieving¹; and
- 4 WHEREAS, although bereavement policies are common among Michigan employers, the
- 5 specifics—such as the number of days granted, the eligibility based on the employee's relationship
- 6 to the deceased, the consideration of pregnancy loss, the consideration of pregnancy loss, and
- 7 whether the leave is paid—are left to the employer's discretion, and therefore inconsistent.² ³; and
- 8 WHEREAS, grief following the death of a loved one can significantly impact an individual's
- 9 mental and physical well-being, workplace performance, increased use of medical services, and
- 10 cause diverse psychological reactions including a significantly higher risk of developing mood and
- anxiety disorders, which can impair their ability to function effectively in both personal and
- 12 professional settings⁴; and
- 13 WHEREAS, pregnancy loss—including miscarriage and stillbirth—has been shown to have
- significant physical and emotional consequences, yet is often excluded from bereavement leave
- policies, leaving grieving parents without adequate time for recovery⁵; and
- WHEREAS, establishing a standardized bereavement leave policy in Michigan would provide
- employees with necessary time to grieve without risking job security or financial hardship, align
- 18 the state with others that have recognized bereavement as a critical public health issue, and ensure
- 19 that all workers—including those experiencing the loss of an immediate family member or
- 20 pregnancy loss—have access to compassionate and equitable workplace policies that support their
- 21 mental and physical well-being; and
- 22 WHEREAS, bereavement leave aligns with the osteopathic principle of whole-person care, which
- 23 recognizes the interconnectedness of mental and physical health and the necessity of workplace
- 24 policies that foster overall well-being; now, therefore, be it
- 25 RESOLVED, that the Michigan Osteopathic Association (MOA) advocates for policies—such as
- 26 required and standardized bereavement leave—that supports the well-being of our patients,
- 27 healthcare providers, and the broader community in alignment with the fundamental principle of
- 28 whole-person care; and, be it further

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- 29 RESOLVED, that the MOA recognizes bereavement leave as a critical public health issue and
- 30 encourages collaboration with policymakers, healthcare organizations, and labor advocates to
- 31 advance bereavement leave policies that align with best practices in workplace health and well-
- 32 being.
