Whereas, Osteopathic senior residents often choose to take allopathic rather than the osteopathic
certification board examination in their specialty; and

- 4 factor in senior residents' decision-making; and
- 5 Whereas, in order to ensure the survival of the osteopathic boards as well as preserving the
- 6 osteopathic profession, it is critical to address costs and other factors which may be dissuading
- 7 residents from choosing the osteopathic certification board option; therefore be it
- 8 **Resolved**, that the Michigan Osteopathic Association (MOA) encourage the American
- 9 Osteopathic Association (AOA) to work with the osteopathic specialty boards to reduce the costs
- 10 associated with osteopathic certification boards in order to become competitive with allopathic
- 11 board examinations; and, be it further
- 12 **Resolved**, that the moa encourage AOA to continue developing potential solutions including
- 13 analysis of costs which result in incentivizing senior osteopathic residents to choose to take
- 14 osteopathic, rather than allopathic, certification board examinations and report actions taken back
- to the MOA House of Delegates in 2022.
