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SUBMITTED TO: Michigan Osteopathic Association House of Delegates SUBMITTED BY: Stephen Swetech, DO, FACOFP **REFERRED TO:** Professional Affairs Reference Committee **RECCOMENDATION:** Disapprove as written **ACTION TAKEN AT MOA HOD:** Whereas, rising costs in all sectors of the economy, including health-care, resulting in an attempt to reduce costs; and Whereas, third party payers have approached companies whose sole purpose is to influence physicians to reduce costly care under the guise of health improvement; and Whereas, studies have indicated that cost reduction has not improved health care metrics; and Whereas, cost care reduction companies, such as Change Healthcare inform third party payer providers with conflicting messages, including providers one month have too many 99214 billed visits, and later report the provider billed too many 99213 visits; Whereas, even a provider's modifier 25 billing codes are scrutinized, despite the complex nature of primary care; therefore, be it **Resolved**, that the MOA alert the third-party payers, such as Blue Cross Blue Shield of Michigan, that the cost reduction corporations, such as Change Healthcare, are just causing uneasiness with providers, tethering on harassment and not improving the health outcomes necessary in health care; and be it further **Resolved**, that the MOA alert third party payers those threatening providers in an adversarial
