ACTION TAKEN AT MOA HOD:

WHEREAS, in the State of Michigan, Dos requires 150 hours of Continuing Medical Education (CME) credits per licensure cycle and that no one is exempt from this requirement are REQUIRED FOR ALL DOS TO MAINTAIN ACTIVE LICENSURE WITHOUT EXCEPTION; and

WHEREAS, arranging for off-site childcare services places MAY PLACE a financial and logistical burden on physicians and their families when completing their 150 CME credits, which may COULD limit the number of events physicians attend and/OR overall participation at conferences IN ORDER TO COMPLETE THE 150 HOURS REQUIREMENT; and

WHEREAS, 50% A VERY SIGNIFICANT PERCENTAGE of incoming medical students are female, the provision of childcare COULD supports BOTH increased membership and participation IN PROFESSIONAL ORGANIZATIONS from BY female medical students, residents, fellows, and attendings; and

WHEREAS, on average, female physicians OFTEN bear a larger proportion of domestic responsibilities, including childcare, which MAY constitutes an unequal limitation to their participation in conferences, ultimately creatEing a barrier to their career development and promotion; and NOW, THEREFORE BE IT

WHEREAS, lack of on site childcare services, may limit the diversity of attendees and the diversity of the content presented at the conferences; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, THAT THE Michigan Osteopathic Association convene a task force to investigate benefits of providing on-site childcare services at the Annual MOA Spring and Autumn Conventions and present their findings to the House of Delegates in 2024; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the Michigan Osteopathic Association asks the financial committee to investigate the potential financial impact of providing childcare services at the annual Spring and Autumn Conventions and present their findings at the House of Delegates in 2024.
