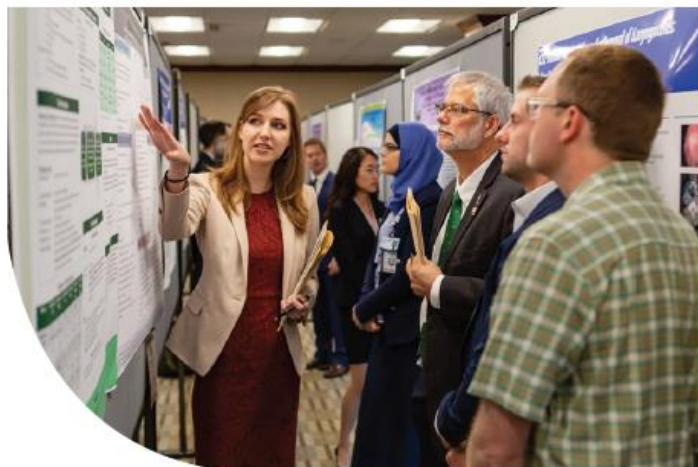

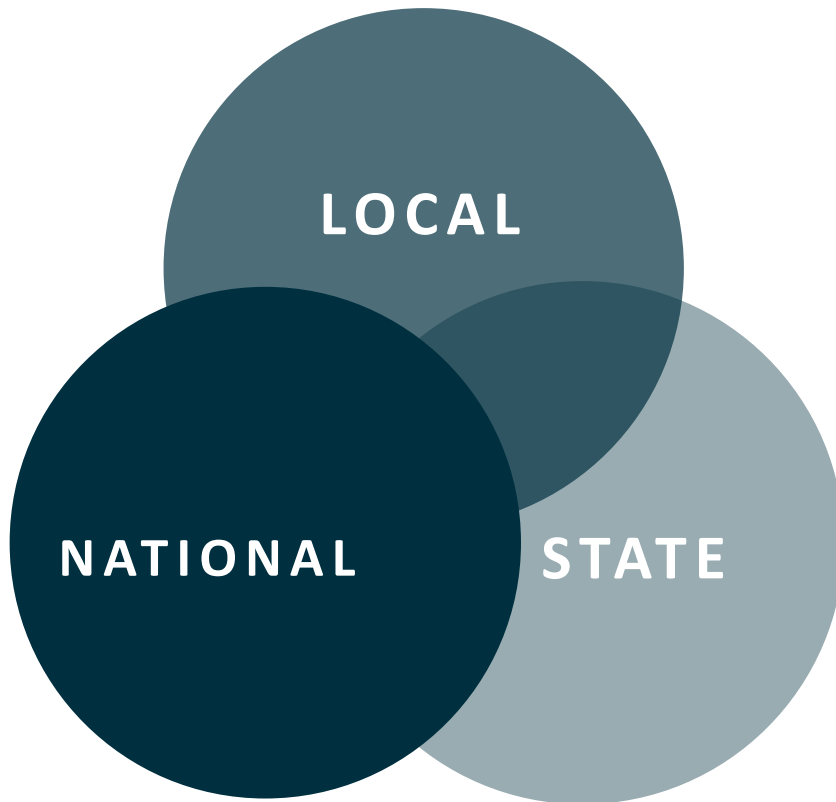

The largest osteopathic convention in the state of Michigan providing an average of 30 AOA Category 1-A credits annually.

This convention is held in May and has more than 700 DO's in attendance.

MOA Annual Autumn Scientific Convention

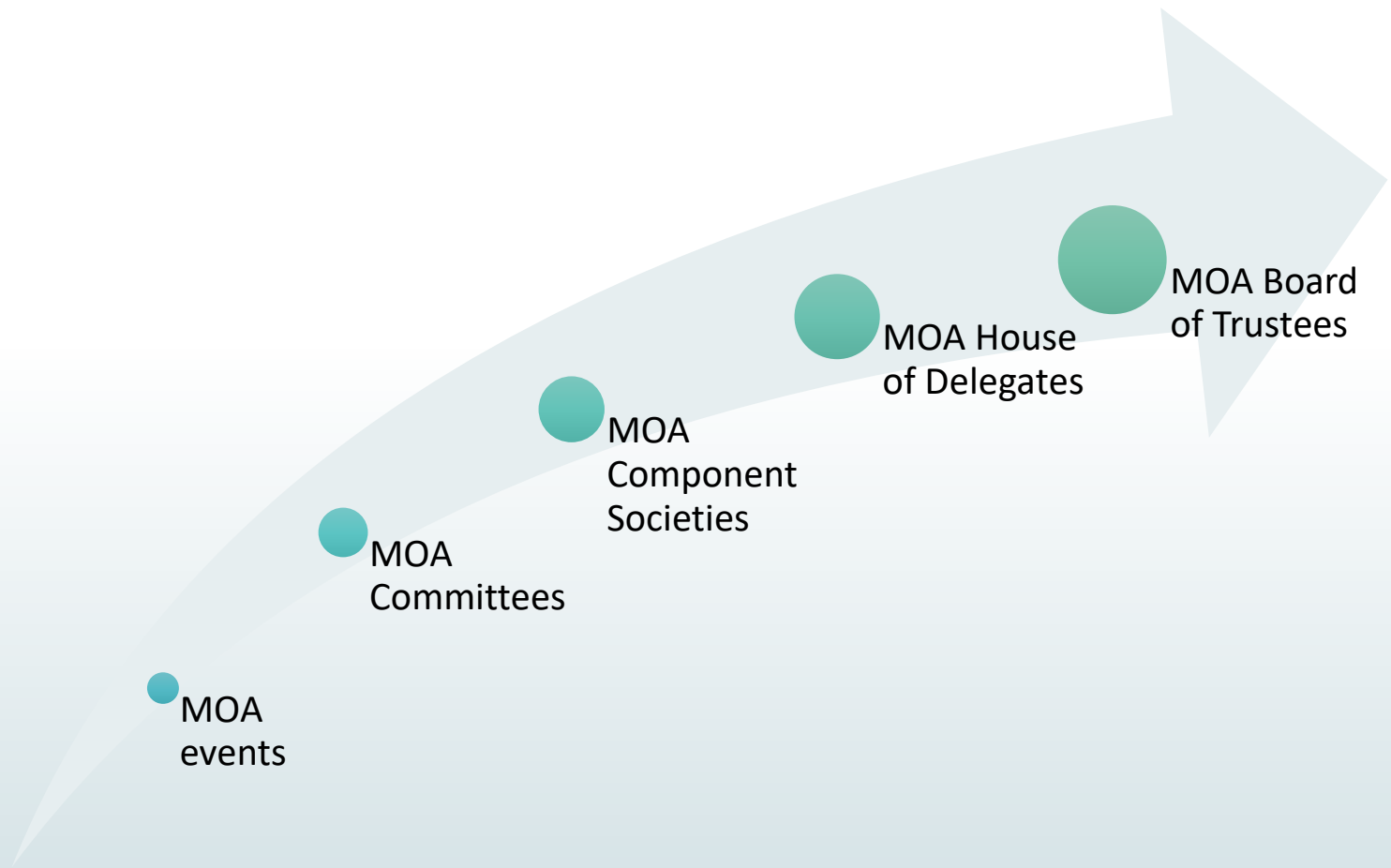
Held in Grand Rapids each November providing an average of 20 AOA Category 1-A credits annually. Has grown to host over 400 DO's.

We are currently identifying more continuing medical education opportunities throughout the state of Michigan (check with your local component society) as well as online options.

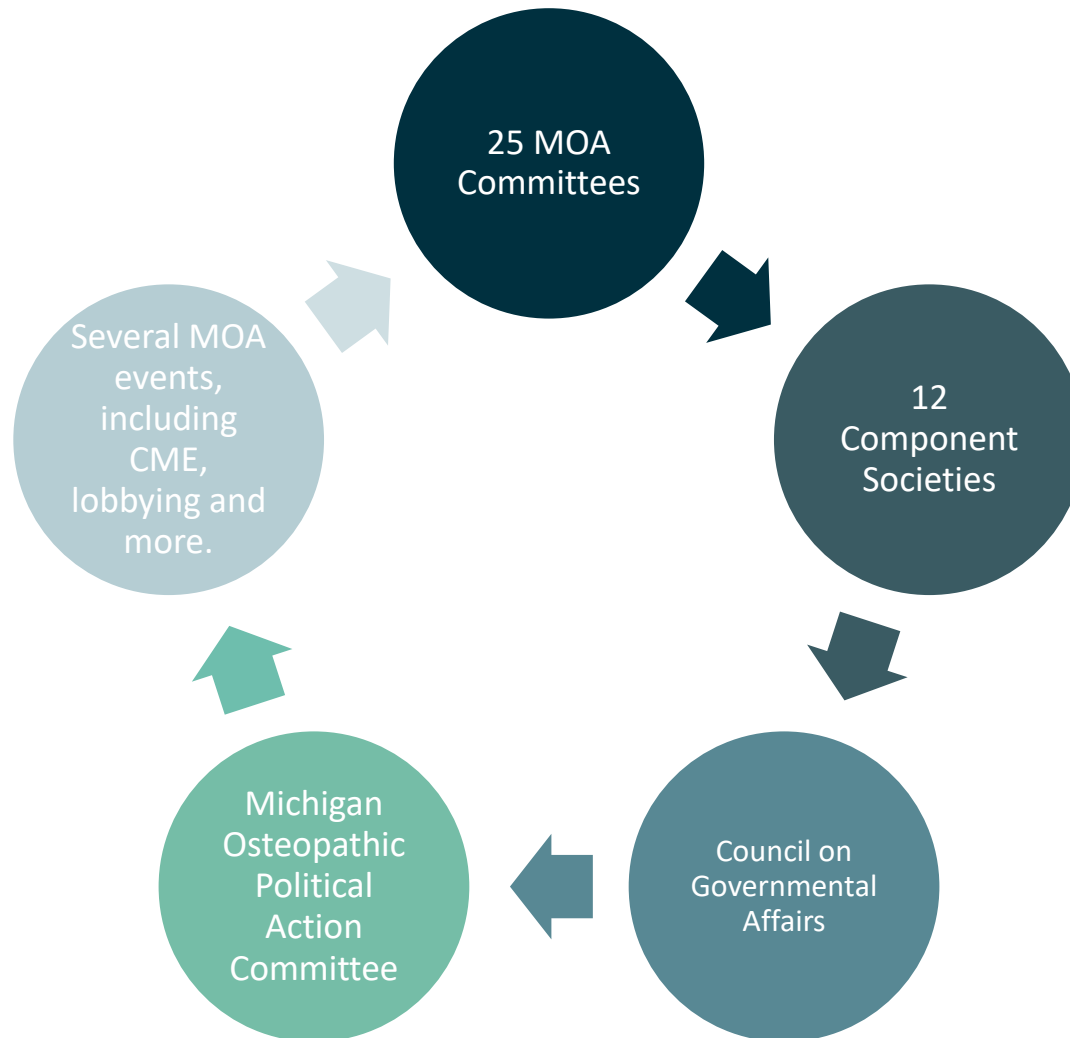


MOA Involvement = Opportunities

* Meets five times per year.

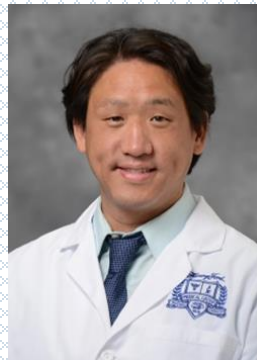

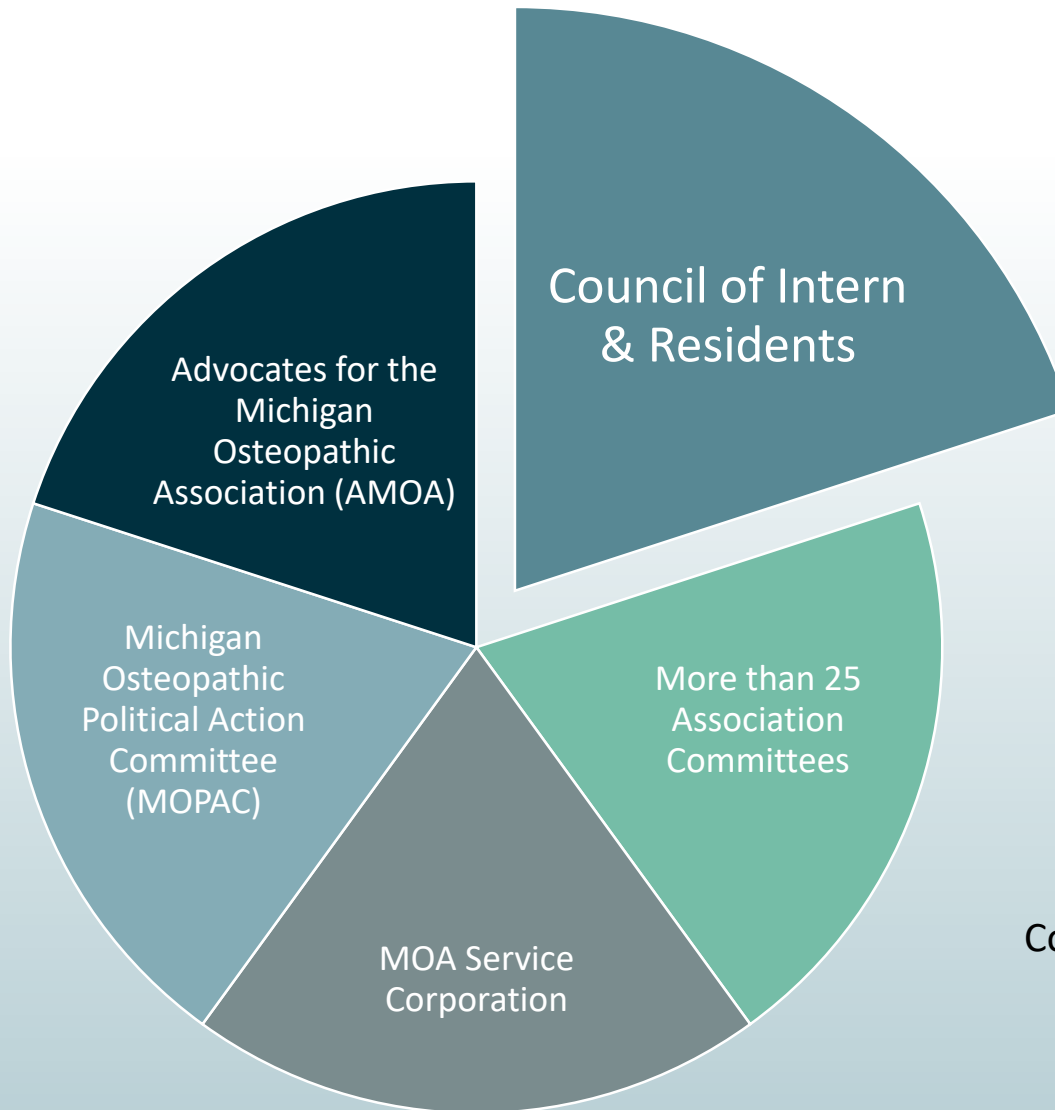


MOA Board of Trustees

- Oversees the activities and policies of the Association.

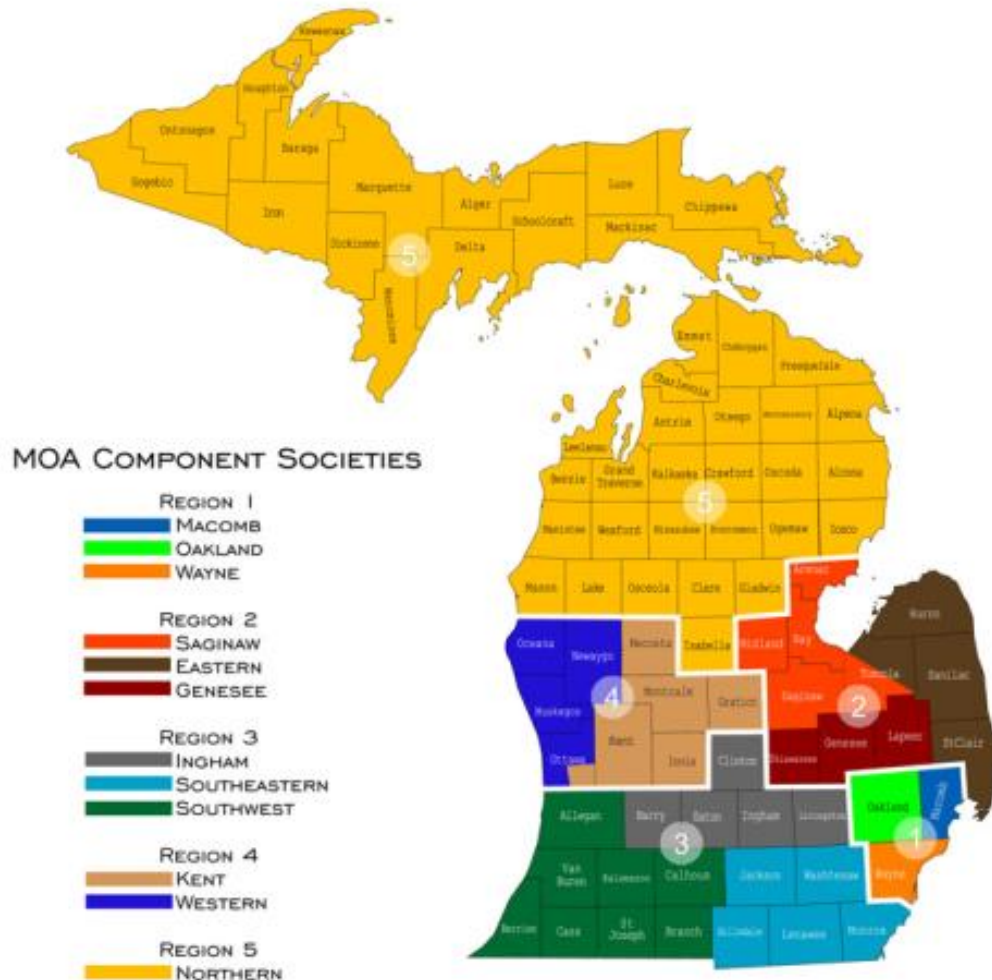


Pieces of the MOA
