


Patient Online Education for Hip Arthroscopy: an Internet Search Analysis


INTRODUCTION

- Osteoarthritis can be caused from normal "wear and tear," genetic predispositions or idiopathic causes¹
- Oftentimes a hip arthroscopy provides excellent visualization and sometimes treat certain etiologies of hip pain²
- Morphometric abnormalities in the hip can predispose to increased stress on the hip and clinically lead to femoroacetabular impingement¹
- People in America largely have access to internet and search engines
- 84% of patients search for information online prior to elective orthopedic procedures via Google³



OBJECTIVES

- To determine the questions searched related to hip arthroscopy
- To compile a list of the most commonly searched questions
- To analyze the quality of the websites to answer these questions
- To help understand patient concerns and the content available
- To understand information and education gaps



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METHODOLOGY

 Six search terms and the first 100 generated by Google's software of frequently asked questions (FAQs) were extracted onto an excel sheet using Scraper Two reviewers first categorized the questions according to Rothwell's classification system^{4, 5} 		How do you poop after hip arthroscopy? How long does arthroscopic hip surgery take? Is hip arthroscopy worth it? Is hip arthroscopy major surgery? What happens if a hip labral tear goes untreated? How painful is hip arthroscopy? Do hip labral tears show up on MRI?
Rothwell's Classification	Description	How do you sleep after hip arthroscopy? Should I walk with hip pain?
Fact	Asks whether something is true and to what extent, objective information Ex: Is hip arthroscopy covered by insurance?	How long is recovery after hip arthroscopy?
Policy Value	Asks whether a specific course of action should be taken to solve a problem Ex: What exercise is good for a hip impingement? Asks for evaluation of an idea, object, or event Ex: How painful is hip arthroscopy:? 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RESULTS

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RESULTS

- 552 unique questions and 371 websites were extracted and categorized
- Of Rothwell's classification, 61.8% of questions ell into fact category
- Diagnosis/Evaluation, indications/management and activities/restrictions were the most searched topics
- Comparatively, questions about cost and ongevity were not as searched as much Commercial had the highest JAMA score (3.53), and Medical Practice (1.76) had the lowest

CONCLUSIONS

- atients appear to be most concerned with iagnosis/Evaluation, Indications/Management, nd Activities/Restrictions related to Hip throscopy
- wide distribution of website content is currently vailable to answer these questions
- ommercial, Social media, and Academic ebsites sources had the highest JAMA scores
- sing the most commonly searched questions, roviders can better understand patient concerns nd further develop patient education resources
- ormulation of better perioperative educational amphlets and lectures can better address their oncerns and may lead to better patient outcomes uture studies should investigate the utility of ontent available to patients

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
